MDS - AMENDMENTS TO THE STATEMENT OF DENTAL REMUNERATION (SDR)

Fees Increase

Please find enclosed an updated SDR, which reflects a 2.78% increase to gross fees and allowances payable from the 1 April 2021. This increase ensures a 3% increase to net pay for GDP's in accordance with DDRB recommendations.

The effective date for implementation of the SDR will be backdated to the 1 April 2021.

The new fees will be automatically applied from the following dates:-

HS45 paper claims submitted after 20 June 2022

EDI Transmissions submitted after 7th July 2022

Changes to Determination I (Scale of Fees)

Gross figures have been updated by 2.78%. The new fees and associated patient charges should be applied to all courses of treatment starting on or after 1 April 2021. However, patient charges which have already been paid by patients and recouped from dentists based on the old fee scale should not be recalculated.

Changes to Determination II (Rates of Remuneration for Salaried Service and the provision of Emergency Dental Service)

Salaried figures have been updated to match figures in extant pay circular [HSC \(TC8\)03/2021](#).

Changes to Determination III (Seniority Payments)

Gross figures have been updated by 2.78%.

Changes to Determination IV (DFT Allowances, GPT Allowances and Post Grad Allowances etc)

Gross figures have been updated by 2.78%.

Changes to Determination V (Maternity, Paternity and Adoption Leave Payments)

Gross figures have been updated by 2.78%.

Changes to Determination VI (Long-Term Sickness)

Gross figures have been uplifted by 2.78%.

Changes to Determination VII (CPD Allowances)

Gross figures and Allowances have been uplifted by 3%.

Changes to Determination VIII (Reimbursement of Non-domestic Rates)

Gross figures have been uplifted by 2.78%.

Changes to Determination IX (Clinical Audit Allowances)

Gross figures have been uplifted by 2.78%.

Changes to Determination X (Practice Allowances)

Gross figures have been uplifted by 2.78%.
